AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MARION, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA ESTABLISHING A MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT ON PORTIONS OF STOUCHSBURG ROAD, SCHOOL ROAD AND SHERIDAN ROAD IN MARION TOWNSHIP, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Marion, Berks County, Pennsylvania and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

1. Pursuant to the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, 75 Pa. C.S.A. 3363, and upon the basis of a traffic and engineering investigation of the following Township roads, it is determined that the current fifty-five (55) mile per hour speed limit on the following sections of roadway is unreasonable and unsafe under the conditions found to exist upon said roadways and that a maximum speed limit hereinafter set forth is herein established for said sections of roadway as a reasonable and safe maximum speed limit and therefore, it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on said roadways at a speed higher than the maximum hereinafter prescribed for that section of roadway:

- 2. Any person who violates any provision of Section 1 above shall, upon conviction of a summary offense, be sentenced to pay a fine of Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35.00) and costs, or as otherwise provided under the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code as it may be amended hereafter, plus any applicable surcharge as may be imposed under the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, as amended. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than five (5) miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of Two Dollars (\$2.00) per mile for each mile in excess of five (5) miles per hour over the maximum speed limit, or as otherwise provided in the Vehicle Code as it may be amended hereafter.
- 3. It is hereby declared that the enactment of this ordinance is necessary for the protection, benefit, and preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the inhabitants of Marion Township.
- 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

This Ordinance shall be effective five (5) days after the date of its enactment.
