

**MARION TOWNSHIP
BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA
ORDINANCE NO. 2021-6**

AN ORDINANCE OF MARION TOWNSHIP, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ESTABLISHING AS A STOP INTERSECTION SPUR ROAD AND SCHOOL ROAD, AUTHORIZING THE PLACEMENT OF AN OFFICIAL STOP SIGN, PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS THEREOF.

The Board of Supervisors of Marion Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania, is authorized pursuant to the Second Class Township Code to enact ordinances to protect public health, safety, and welfare with Marion Township.

The Board of Supervisors has jurisdiction over Marion Township's streets and roads, including the right to erect traffic control devices in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, by the Board of Supervisors of Marion Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania (the "Township"), and it is hereby **ENACTED AND ORDAINED** by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1. It is herein determined that the following intersection shall be established as a "stop intersection", and an official "Stop" sign shall be erected (or is ratified if previously erected) in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named street (the through street) on the first-named street (the stop street) in the direction indicated.

<u>Stop Street</u>	<u>Through Street</u>	<u>Direction of Travel</u>
Spur Road	School Road	East

SECTION 2. Every driver of a vehicle approaching the intersection on the first-named or stop street shall stop the vehicle as required by the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, 75 Pa. C.S. Section 3323(b) (the "Code"), and shall not proceed into or across the intersection until he or she has followed all applicable requirements of that Section of the Code.

SECTION 3. Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) and costs, in addition to fines, costs, and penalties prescribed by the Code.

SECTION 4. The Board of Supervisors is authorized to place the Stop sign of the form and type approved and authorized by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT), in the manner required under PennDOT regulations, for the stop intersection.

SECTION 5. If any sentence, clause, section or part of this Ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity

shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Township Board of Supervisors that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.

SECTION 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as they are inconsistent with this Ordinance.


SECTION 7. This Ordinance shall become effective on the earliest date allowable under applicable law.

ORDAINED and **ENACTED** as an Ordinance by the Board of Supervisors of the Marion Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania, in lawful session, duly assembled, this 30th day of December, 2021.




